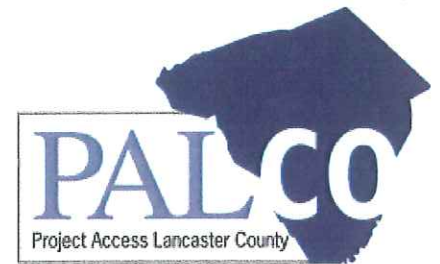
On May 12th, Lancaster General Health President and CEO Tom Beeman will host Tocqueville Society members in the Executive Board Room at the LGH Foundation for a topical discussion about United Way's Primary and Preventive Health Care Priority and PALCO (Project Access Lancaster County). Watch for your invitation. Seating will be limited and awarded on a first come first serve basis.

At this session, we will learn about the needs of the Lancaster community in the area of health. Jan Bergen, Chair of United Way's Health Solution Council, will tell us how United Way and the community are developing and supporting strategies that will improve the health of Lancaster County's citizens.

We will also hear about PALCO, an organized system of healthcare for low-income, uninsured patients led by physician volunteers partnering with existing healthcare and related resources in the community to give better and more cost-effective care. It is estimated that 75% of the uninsured in Lancaster County are low-income, uninsured adults.

Consistent, quality, preventive care has significant benefits:

- Early care is better care and costs less than late crisis management care;
- Less unnecessary emergency department use is cost saving;
- Coordinated care can provide better health at lower cost than uncoordinated care.
